IFC Inspector Certifications

Fire Code Inspector I

The Fire Inspector I Certification demonstrates satisfactory knowledge of the relevant provisions of the International Fire Code in the inspection and evaluation of new and existing fire-prevention, fire detection and fire-control measures, and other related life-safety provisions for compliance with the International Fire Code.

The scope of certification follows Fire Inspector I standards as specified in NFPA 1031—*Professional Qualifications for Fire Inspector and Plan Examiner*.

Certification References:

- 2012 International Fire Code (ICC), including Appendix B
- 2012 International Building Code (ICC), specifically Chapter 2, 4, 6 and 7*
- Fire Inspection and Code Enforcement, 6th Edition (IFSTA)

(Many have found this reference to be optional for Inspector I Certification. Certification references are based on the current Candidate Bulletin and are subject to change.)

Fire Code Inspector II

Fire Code Inspector II Certification demonstrates satisfactory knowledge of the relevant provisions of the IFC in the inspection and evaluation of new and existing fire-prevention, fire detection and fire-control measures, and other related life-safety provisions for compliance with the IFC.

The scope of this certification follows Fire Inspector II standards specified by NFPA 1031, *Professional Qualifications for Fire Inspector and Plan Examiner*. This examination includes some plan reading questions. Fire Code Inspector I Certification is

a mandatory prerequisite to be certified as a Fire Inspector II per ICC requirements.

- 2012 International Building Code (ICC), specifically Chapter 1-8 and 10
- Fire Inspection and Code Enforcement, 6th Edition (IFSTA)

This program is intended to familiarize individuals with the International Fire Code. It does not “teach to the code”. Participants seeking certification should plan additional self-study.
